PROGRAM: FORGOTTEN FRIDAY: THE APRIL 7, 1865 ACTIONS IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY, VA

Historians often overlook the multiple engagements that occurred in Cumberland County near Sailor's Creek (April 6) and at Appomattox (April 9). These battles resulted in the death, wounding, or capture of three generals, the near capture of General Robert E. Lee, and a "Lee to the rear" incident. The battles near Cumberland Church were both fascinating and horrific, resulting in hundreds of casualties. Join Patrick Schroeder, Historian of Appomattox Court House National Historical Park, to discover more about these often-forgotten events.



SPEAKER: PATRICK SCHROEDER

Civil War Author/Historian Patrick A. Schroeder was born in 1968, at Fort Belvoir, VA. Patrick attended Stuarts Draft High School in Augusta County, VA. In the spring of 1990, he graduated Cum Laude with a B.S. in Historical Park Administration from Shepherd College, Shepherdstown, WV. He has an M.A. in Civil War History from Virginia Tech. From the summer of 1986-1993, Patrick worked as a seasonal living history interpreter at Appomattox Court House National Historical Park. In 1993, he wrote "Thirty Myths About Lee's Surrender," which is currently in its twelfth printing. From 1994 - 1999, the author worked at Red Hill, the Patrick Henry National Memorial. From 1999 -



2002, Patrick was an independent researcher. Patrick is now the full-time Historian of Appomattox Court House National Historical Park. He also serves as historian for the

Appomattox Petersburg Preservation Society, which is dedicated to preserving battlefield land from the Appomattox Campaign.

Albeit much of the historical thrust is the Revolutionary War, the plain fact is without the Civil War and the Union efforts to preserve the Union, we would not be marking a commemoration event.

The fact that the Union military forces fought to keep the United States whole and viable will unlikely be celebrated in 2026. We Americans like our history pure and unadulterated! Men such as Lincoln, Grant, among other Union leaders, and the magnificence of the Union Army rank and file and their fighting spirit, should be remembered with any celebration of our nation's history. We have a rare and unique opportunity to use the America250 effort to recall and celebrate the occasion of how the Union saved the country to serve as an enticement to recruit new members whilst retaining current members!

Although the focus will differ from state-to-state, and the America 250 Foundation focuses on a variety of commemoration activities, history will remain a crucial focal point for many states and local communities.

Typically, the states have posted some sort of a "statement of principles" on organizing for and promoting the Sesquicentennial observance. Chief among these points (paraphrased here) are:

- To expand enduring educational assets including access to resources, interactive exhibits, and opportunities to learn more about the founding of the country (and beyond—to include local history events of note).
- To offer enhanced learning opportunities to students and teachers including curriculum development resources, teaching resources, and professional development opportunities, and in the case of our Roundtables, learning more about how we saved the Union during the American Civil War. Any reflection on our nation's history over the last 250 years should include a spotlight on how our nation fought a war to save the union.

- To expand a state's economic impact and provide more employment opportunities. This is a common theme across the states, especially in the State of Virginia where commemoration activities, beginning with Jamestown, the 150th Anniversary of the Civil War, the WWI Centennial, brought in millions of dollars of revenue to Virginia in the guise of tourism, museum revenues, reenacting events, etc.
- To ensure that all communities achieve their objectives in highlighting their unique roles in the nation's 250th anniversary.

Virginia hired a consulting firm, Wilkening Consulting, to explore ways of getting more Americans to engage with history: https://wilkeningconsulting.com/americans-our-history-and-the-250th/

Although the work was designed for the Virginia250 Commission, the data is relevant to sustaining our Roundtable with critical thinking on how we appeal to new members and more importantly, thinking on the sustainability of our beloved CWRTF and the important role we play in maintaining the rich and vibrant legacy of Civil War History here in the Fredericksburg area.
